Criteria:

- 1) You must be a high school senior, entering a School of Higher Education in the year of your graduation.
- 2) You must be an active member of a church within the Pennsylvania Koinonia Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction COGIC
- 3) You must submit a letter of recommendation from your Pastor. He/She will attest to your commitment to the Lord and the local church.
- 4) You must have a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) OF 2.0 (please submit a copy of your school transcript/report)

***You must submit a brief biographical sketch – typed on a separate sheet – including your educational goals and life aspirations; Who are the people who have had the most positive impact on your life and why; How has your church and knowledge of God influenced your lifestyle! {Essay must be typed, no less than 500 and no more than 1000 words, double spaced}**
